

This database provides a mix of full text (complete access) and abstract only access to a range of New Zealand and Australian veterinary and animal science publications.

Searching the database

Search tips:

- There's no need to enter your search as a sentence (e.g. The effect of the parvovirus in canines). Instead, just enter the words that need to show up in your search results (e.g. parvovirus canine).
- There's also no need to put AND between words or use punctuation, such as commas, to separate words.

The database opens to the advanced search screen but the **simple search** is often all you need.

You can also **browse** the content of this database by **Subject** (and a heap of other options).

Managing your search results

The **Filter your results** menu (to the left of your results), lets you limit your search results by a range of options and the **Subject Terms** filter is especially helpful. Here are some of the Subject terms that results on the 'parvovirus canine' search are linked to. Click on the most appropriate heading to narrow your results further.

Browsing your search results

To view the abstract or summary of a result, click on the **title** or **Abstract/Full details**.

Accessing results

The results with the **S** or the **O** are **fully available**. You'll be able to download the full text of the article as a pdf.
